Discussion Forum Guidelines and Rubric

Please review the following guidelines for Discussion Forum postings:

- Be thoughtful.
- Respond to at least two of your classmates' postings—you and your classmates will learn more if you share ideas.
- ❖ If you have time, respond to more than two postings—this will make your class discussions richer.
- ❖ If a student's post already has two responses, respond to another student's post instead. Every student's post should have at least two responses.
- ❖ Reflect on people's responses to your postings. Read your classmates' responses and consider how their responses affect your thinking.
