

ED5154 Information Sheet – Continuing Education Credits at the Graduate Level

Practicum: Delivering an Online Course

Course Description

This practicum supports participants as they implement delivery of the online course that they designed in the ED5153 course. Participants will participate in a faculty-led semester-long online forum with other student facilitators and designers, which will explore critical issues in online course delivery. Topics the practicum will address include developing online activities, building an online learning community, assessment, and effective integration of multimedia elements in online courses.

Course Requirements

Participants are required to deliver an online course and participate in the ETLO Forum throughout the facilitation, posting at least eight times during that period. Participants are also required to submit a final product to the course instructor via email, with the following three items:

- 1. Required elements from delivering the online course,
- 2. Annotated postings from the Forum, and
- 3. A final reflective paper.

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ED5154: Course Requirements

ED5154 is a practicum course that functions as a graduate-level seminar, using the ETLO Forum for communication among participants and faculty. Participants are required to deliver an online course and participate in the Forum throughout the facilitation, posting at least eight times. Participants are also required to submit a final product to the course instructor via email, with the following items: 1) required elements from delivering the course, 2) annotated postings from the Forum, and 3) a final reflective paper.
